The Course

The Field Guides Association of Southern Africa (FGASA) accredited full Apprentice Trails Guide Course (28 days) is conducted in the amazing Okavango Delta in Botswana. There is a maximum of eight participants per course, ensuring personalised attention and first-hand experience for all students and participants.

Although the primary objective is to achieve the Apprentice Trails Guide qualification, we place strong emphasis on the ethos surrounding trails.

PHASE 1

The courses will take place at our African Bush Company tented camp in the Okavango Delta. We commence with the Advanced Rifle Handling (ARH) theory, training and assessment components.

We also start with introductory walks during which the participants may begin logging walking hours and dangerous game encounters towards the Apprentice Trails Guide qualification.

PHASE 2

In this phase of the course we will spend nights out on a 'Wilderness Trail' in the Okavango Delta, without camp or vehicle facilities.

Nights are spent sleeping in the open, under the stars (no tents), with each participant taking turns at "watch duty", ensuring the group's safety.

All food and equipment are carried in backpacks, water is found or provided.



PHASE 3

From day 15 we focus on logging well beyond the minimum requirement of 50 walking hours and 10 potentially dangerous game encounters. Between walks we concentrate on the remaining Trails Guide theory modules. Once all the lectures have been completed, there will be a brief study period before the FGASA Trails Guide Theory exam takes place.

Track and sign training will be ongoing, preparing you for a CyberTracker Track & Sign Assessment (not included).

The Course



During the course we will spend an average of seven hours walking on most days. You will be able to log valuable walking hours and dangerous game encounters with a highly experienced mentor who will guide you through the process of approaching and retreating from dangerous game on foot, as well as interpretation and professional guest handling.

A typical day starts with waking up prior to sunrise. After coffee & rusks we head out on a four to five hour walk, as soon as sufficient daylight allows.

We return to camp around midday for lunch, followed by either a short lecture, or a few hours of free time. Around 3pm we head out again for a two to three hour walk, to gain more valuable hours and encounters.

Dinner and a campfire await us back at camp, time for daily de-briefs and exchange with your fellow participants, usually followed by an early night.

We will be walking for long periods at times in rather rugged conditions, so you should be fit and prepared to get hot and dirty. This is all part of being a Trails Guide operating in Africa's wild areas.

The Camp

Our camp in the Okavango Delta in Botswana lies on the banks of a river, overlooking a beautiful lagoon.

Fantastic birding, resident Hippos and regular visits of Elephants or Lions are just a view highlights of this amazing camp in a true wilderness location.

It consists of eight 3x3m dome tents on wooden decks, a communal area for dining, learning or relaxing, a classroom directly at the lagoon and a big braai-area for evening get-togethers.

The shared tents include a private deck, twin beds, mattresses, solar lights, shower, hand basin and a chemical toilet.

After booking confirmation you will be provided with a detailed map as well as driving directions from Maun.

The last part of the road is deep sand so a 4x4 vehicle is required to reach the camp if you plan to drive on your own.
